

## Trail User Notes 23/03/12

**On this page we post notes about sections of the trail of which users should be aware:**

1. Fallen trees: There is one tree still to be removed on the section from the junction with the B862 (OS 245777/811746) and the Knockie road ( OS 245707/812576) Elsewhere there are a few trees down through the short section of woodland beyond the highest point of the Fair Haired Lad's Pass. We have made the Forestry Commission aware of these and expect that they will be cleared soon. In the meantime although passable for walkers, it is difficult for both cyclists and horse riders
2. We are pleased to report that the section of trail between Foyers and Whitebridge that was very muddy, has now been much improved thanks to the work of Highland Council contractors. Nearby, they have also improved a very short section between stock gates that had become equally as bad.
3. We are pleased to report that a section of trail between Inverfarigaig and Foyers which has become very muddy, is presently being upgraded by the Forestry Commission. Please exercise caution over this section until completed.
4. Our downloadable maps (PDF's) are produced in colour, and the trail is highlighted in yellow which does not render well in black and white. For this reason to avoid confusion we strongly recommended that you print off the maps on our website with a colour printer.
5. Beyond Suidhe Chuimein, between the boundary with Forestry Commission Scotland (FCS) land and the B862 there is a very short section which is way marked only and there is no clear trail. Also FCS have been felling in this area recently so please take care and observe any warning signs.
6. The trail then follows the line of the B862 for a few hundred metres. All users should exercise caution here. Although it is a quiet road some vehicles travel at excessive speed on it.
7. There is a small section of way marked only trail on the Whitebridge side of the bridge over the river at Ardochy. However, the line of the trail is reasonably clear.
8. At the top of the Corkscrew be aware that there are a few fields with cattle which are not contained by fences and are often on the trail route.
9. Between Cullaird Farm and Torbreck there are no way markers. This is at the request of the landowner. However, the direction to follow is clear on the route map
